Letter from the Superintendent

Dear Parents and Community Members:

Welcome to the 2014-2015 school year! I am honored and excited to be the new Superintendent of Schools for the Canastota Central School District. Canastota has a rich heritage, strong traditions, close knit families and a passion for our students and school. The school is truly an integral part of the community. I am proud to be a part of Canastota Schools and am eager to continue serving the district, but in a new capacity!

School opened for students on Thursday, September 4th. It was great to have everyone back! Opening days went smoothly, with lots of smiling faces and positive energy! Administrators, teachers, office assistants, technicians, nurses, cafeteria and transportation departments worked tirelessly to prepare for the opening of school.

Our buildings and grounds looked fantastic thanks to the hard work of our buildings/grounds and custodial/cleaner staff. A few highlights of their work include new ceiling tiles placed throughout high school classrooms, a new sidewalk in front of the high school and a new sidewalk apron on the north exterior hallway of the high school. A new electronic sign was also recently installed in front of the Roberts Street Complex.

We are very excited to welcome new faculty and support staff to our District! While many of these positions are a result of past attrition, some have been brought back from previous staff reductions and some are new based upon our students' needs. You will find their biographies in this newsletter. Along with our new staff, we welcome our new Assistant Superintendent for Instruction, Mr. Jason Mitchell and Ms. Melissa Stanek, our new K-3 Assistant Principal.

Last year we adopted the curricular modules from the State Education Department to help facilitate the change to the new Common Core Standards. We found that no curriculum is perfect and that there were some pieces missing. As a result we moved

forward with reading, writing and math crosswalks. Teachers compared the modules with the standards and decided what needed to be paired down, cut out, added or revised. We are now using the modules as a framework with more of an adaptive approach to meet the needs of our students.

We received our 3-8 ELA and math state test scores in mid-August. We saw progress as some grade levels saw an increase in student achievement, however; overall we are not where we want to be. While they are only one of multiple measures we use to assess student achievement, these new assessments are an important indicator of progress. Data from these tests will help us focus on what is working in classroom instruction and what we can learn from best practices. The tests will help us see where we are and what we need to do to improve students' academic success. Growth on these assessments represents a step along the way to meeting the State expectations. The class of 2022, and every class thereafter, will be required to pass Common Core Regents exams with scores of at least 75. These tests serve as a benchmark of their progress. We saw five grade levels improve on these assessments. While we are not where we want to be yet, we are headed in the right direction and have a plan to ensure improved student achievement. The District will analyze the results, implement the adapted curricula mentioned above, adapt instructional practices where necessary, and provide professional development as needed. Teachers, administrators, parents and students have worked very hard to implement the new changes we have seen over the past few years. We will continue to focus on growth and how we can improve instruction in our classrooms. We are all committed to preparing our students for their futures.

I have a vision for Canastota Schools – to be a school of excellence! That includes academic excellence, cultural excellence, excellence with parental/community relationships, and excellence with our facilities. But my vision is nothing without your involvement. We need a shared vision from all stakeholders-faculty, staff, administration, parents, students, community members and Board of Education. We need to evaluate where we are as a District to determine our path for the next 5-10 years. Please be thinking about the following questions:

- What are our strengths as a District?
- What are our areas of concern?
- Where do you want the District to be in the next 5-10 years?
- How will we get there? What realistic solutions do you suggest to address our concerns?

In the next few months I will meet with school, parent and community groups to get your input on these questions. In addition, please feel free to email or call me with your thoughts. Afterwards, I will collate all stakeholder's thoughts and present at a later time. This will be used to guide us into the future and in our decision making at all levels.

I would like to thank all of you for your continuous support, efforts and dedication to our students and District. Together, we will make a difference.

Peterboro Street Elementary School Morning Program – A time for building a positive learning environment and teaching character education!



First thing each Friday morning all classes gather in the gym for morning program. Led by kindergarten teachers Mrs. Paul and Mrs. Cassavaw and school social worker Mrs. Callegari, the program begins with everyone saying the Pledge of Allegiance together. Mrs. Pierce's Pre--K class is teaching us how to say the Pledge using sign language! We then sing My Country 'tis of Thee. Announcements come next - the date, the day in our 5 day cycle and birthdays.

Clifford the Big Red Dog is used as our character education mascot. Each month there is a new "Clifford's Big Idea" (or character ed. theme). The big idea is introduced the first Friday of each month and referred to and discussed during the rest of the Fridays of that month. Stories, songs, role plays and other methods are used to illustrate and reinforce the themes.

The last part of morning program is the announcement of the Super Citizens for that week. Students earn Super Citizen by demonstrating expected behavior in all areas of school. When they are announced, each student comes up to receive their certificate and stand in line in front of the whole school. We give them a big round of applause. It is an honor to receive Super Citizen! A picture is then taken of all the super citizens for that week and it is hung in the main hallway for all to see.


Morning program is a great way to end our busy weeks at Peterboro Street Elementary School!

On the very first day of school students were taught all of the expectations throughout the building. The focus for each area is for students to be safe, be respectful, and be responsible. All students have been introduced to the appropriate voice levels for each area as well. Our voice levels are o for silent, I for whisper/partner voice, 2 for speaking voice and 3 for outside recess voice. With staff all using the same vocabulary, students have a clear understanding of how they need to behave. The students have been doing an amazing job learning and following these expectations! Through this program students and staff can continue to work together to create a positive and caring school community.

The South Side Singers!

The South Side School is excited to announce a major addition to our music curriculum that has the whole building really "tuning up" and ready to shine. Following some adjustments to our scheduling, we are now able to include ALL 3rd Graders in chorus during the school day! Canastota High School CTE-Business Department Receives CTE Diploma Approval from the State Education Department

The Canastota High School CTE-Business Department was recently notified that they have received reapproval from the New York State Department of Education to offer diploma endorsement in three of their business programs:

The CTE diploma endorsement shows that a student has completed a technical and academic curriculum that achieves the commencement level of the appropriate New York State Learning Standards. Students enrolled in the CTE program must pass an industry-approved technical assessment, as well as the New York State required five Regents examinations to earn a technical endorsement on their diploma

New York's state-approval process for career and technical education programs raises the quality and rigor of courses that prepare students for employment and postsecondary study. Approved programs lead to an industry-recognized credential.


Gabriella Couchman - Family and Consumer Sciences Teacher, Jr./Sr. **High School**


Deb Wilhelm - Kindergarten Aide, Peterboro Elementary

Canastota Central School District has signed on with SchoolMessenger, a leading provider of notification services for parental outreach, emergency broadcasts, student attendance alerts and other communications for education.

The SchoolMessenger system is designed to automatically notify parents for reasons that impact the safety and academic performance of students. SchoolMessenger will extend the district's existing community outreach efforts and emergency preparedness procedures, as well as inform parents of upcoming school events such as statewide testing and parent meetings. As a comprehensive communication tool, SchoolMessenger will contribute to the district's involvement initiatives, allowing the district to engage the broader educational community about a wide range of topics affecting students' academic success.

SchoolMessenger will not replace current school communication methods. Principals will still be accessible for live visits and will continue to communicate via current methods including paper-based memoranda. The district's acquisition of the SchoolMessenger system is intended to extend its commitment to remain personally connected with parents by offering additional and timely communications. 
School Messenger also provides SMS text messaging, **but only if you subscribe or optin**. In order to participate in the new service you must indicate your willingness to receive text messages to your phone. The process is simple and only takes a few seconds to complete.

Simply text any one of the following words to the number **68453**: subscribe, optin, yes. You'll know you were successful if you receive the following reply message:

You are registered to receive aprox 3 msgs/mo. Txt STOP to quit, HELP for help. You'll want to repeat the opt-in process for any wireless numbers that you wish to include.

Capital Maintenance Project

Since last February the District has worked with King and King Architects and the Community Facilities Committee to assess the current condition of our buildings. The committee is made up of community members, Board representatives, our architect, faculty, staff, administration and students. Based on the five year Building Condition Survey, King and King gave the committee a scope of work that needed to be done. The committee conducted walkthroughs of our buildings to assess current physical conditions and efficiency, and then prioritized the list of recommended work. Based on the information reviewed, the committee recommended that the District make necessary repairs and needed upgrades to maintain and preserve our buildings. The District will be putting up for referendum a capital maintenance project in the amount of \$11,950,000. The estimated local share of the project after factoring in 87.5% in state aid is equal to \$1,500,000. The District is proposing to use \$1,050,000 in capital reserve funds to offset the local share. Therefore, the tax impact on our community members will be \$9.00 per \$100,000 in home value (before STAR) annually.

The work being done will include the following:

- PSES window replacement, flooring upgrades
- SSES some window replacement, flooring upgrades, ventilation and plumbing upgrades
- RSES & JSHS partial roof replacement (high school library), rest room renovations (gym, lobby area), ventilation upgrades and upgrades to the science wing
- Bus Garage/Educational Annex roof replacement

A public presentation and facility tour will be conducted on Tuesday, October 7, 2014 in the Forum Room at the High School. A public hearing will be held on October 14th and the referendum vote is scheduled for October 21st. We encourage you to come to our public meetings and facility tours to learn more about this proposed capital maintenance project. Please remember to vote.
