A message from the Superintendent

Thank you to our students, parents, faculty, staff, alumni and community members for being supportive and engaged contributors to a remarkably successful academic year! We have much to look back on with pride, and many achievements to celebrate.

Most recently, the 135th Commencement Ceremony was a fitting tribute to 111 graduates who met the challenges set forth by the New York State Education Department. An unprecedented 100 percent of the seniors who started the school year graduated on June 25. Adding to that impressive statistic, several graduates will receive a combined total of \$844,800 in financial aid from their chosen colleges and universities. I congratulate you all, and wish you well in your future endeavors. I encourage you



to stay connected to your alma mater as the years go by, so future generations of Canastota students can benefit from your involvement as alumni. I also send heartfelt thanks to the teachers, staff, and parents who supported our graduates throughout their academic careers.

Many of our students completed Career and Technical Education courses at Madison-Oneida BOCES, in addition to completing requirements for high school graduation. We are proud of them for these additional accomplishments.

Future Canastota graduates took important steps toward that goal with their Pre-K. Kindergarten and 6th grade moving up ceremonies. We celebrate these milestones with them.

We recognized roughly half of the Class of 2016 at the Senior Awards Night. Over \$100,000 in awards and scholarships were presented to students for their achievements in academics, athletics and community service. This is the largest disbursement to date, thanks to the generosity of the Canastota Central School District community that makes this robust awards program possible.

Earlier this year we were recognized by U.S. News and World Report with a Bronze Medal ranking in its list of the best high schools in the country for 2016. The magazine compiles data on more than 21,000 public high schools, and this outstanding accomplishment shows the progress our District is making in its mission of "Striving for Excellence."

The District must also express sincere appreciation for the community's passage of the 2016-2017 budget and bus referendum. We will continue to work diligently to be good stewards of your tax monies as we provide the best possible education to each and every one of our students.

The community showed its strong involvement in the District, as eight candidates vied for four open seats in the Board of Education elections. Please join me in congratulating Mr. Doug Gustin on his re-election to the board. Please also welcome Mr. Timothy Bazan, Mr. Loran Crosby, and Mr. Bill Haddad, three new board members who began their terms on July 1.

We have a busy summer planned, as we implement the Capital Project – Phase II, with facility renovations at Peterboro Street Elementary School, South Side Elementary School, and the High School. These structural improvements will enrich the academic experience for our children.

It has been a wonderful year, and there is so much more to reflect on and look forward to. 


Photo Essay: Capital Project - Phase II













Work has started on Phase II of the Capital Project at South Side Elementary School, Peterboro Street Elementary School and the Junior/ Senior High School. As with any construction project, safety and minimal disruptions to the educational process are our top concerns. In mid-June, faculty and staff worked

In mid-June, faculty and staff worked with movers to box up items and get them transferred into storage. Over the summer, construction crews will be working to replace worn flooring and carpeting with new vinyl composition tile (VCT); install new heating units, lights, counters and cabinets; install new wall partitions; replace windows; install new ceilings; and paint. At SSES, the main entrance doors will be replaced and a new exterior sidewalk ramp will be installed near the gym entrance.

Carefully thought-out plans are in place to address any concerns and to keep the project on schedule. Fully compliant asbestos abatement is being conducted during the renovations.

New windows for Peterboro Street Elementary School are set to arrive in August. As a result, some installation will take place while school is in session in September. Students in the affected areas will briefly move into designated locations prepared to host them while windows are replaced two rooms at a time.

From time to time, I am asked about the Wall of Distinction, located in the tunnel by the High School gymnasium. As a Board of Education member who played a part in its conception and development, I would like to share the Wall's history and basic premise.

The primary mission of the Wall of Distinction is not, as many have come to believe, to recognize people who made contributions to community, state or country, although that is certainly an important component of the bylaws. The underlying purpose of the Wall of Distinction is to show people that no goal is out of reach, no ideal is too lofty, no dream unattainable if they possess a degree from Canastota Central Schools.

As parents of athletes, my wife and I traveled to many schools during our children's tenure at CHS. I noticed that in many districts there were areas, often near the gym, where tribute was paid to graduates of that particular district. Other Board members had also witnessed such displays, and so the concept of such a wall was born.

We as a board seized upon this opportunity to present the district in a positive light. As a place where successful, outstanding individuals were launched.

The bylaws have as a cornerstone requirement that inductees must be graduates of the Canastota Central School District. We have a selection committee that is charged with determining who the nominees will be. These dedicated members have a wealth of knowledge about Canastota's schools, are apolitical and unbiased. They retain their anonymity to avoid undue influence from the community or those campaigning to get their personal candidates nominated.

The Wall of Distinction was designed to honor Canastota's education system by recognizing individuals whose accomplishments range are all-encompassing, from community service, education, athletics and science to medicine, law, engineering, politics, literature, the armed services and more. The Wall's greatest accomplishment, however, is to remind students every day that no dream is unattainable with a Canastota Central Schools diploma in hand.


