Students Meet Principals' Reading Challenge

PSES and SSES rose to their Principals' Reading Challenge by logging more than 7,000 books during the six-week event!

This was the 12th year of the event for preK-3 students. The principals set a target of 1,000 books per school and kicked off with a visit in May from children's author Kate Feiffer who talked about some of her books and shared her love of dogs.

Students could read on their own, read aloud or have someone read to them, and they tracked their books on dog-themed logs and charts. Halfway through the

challenge, students voted on the schoolwide prize if they met the challenge. PSES chose to watch their principal's dog run an obstacle course, and SSES students chose a meet-and-greet with their principal's dog.

Senior Earns CTE Certification



Chyann Wagoner, a 2019 graduate, was the sole student this year to earn a CTE Certification through the Canastota High School Business Department! She earned a double certification in Accounting and Software Engineering (Computer Programming).

For both programs, Chyann needed to pass Computer Applications I & II and Career and Financial Management. For Accounting, she completed additional courses in Entrepreneurship and Accounting, and a national exam. For Software Engineering, she completed Business Occupations, Web Design & Advanced Web Design, and Computer Programming I & II, and a national exam.

Yearbook Receives National Honor

The Canastota Yearbook was named a Program of Excellence for its high-quality publication. It is the first time Canastota has been recognized for its yearbook and it is one of only 366 public and private schools in the nation to receive this honor.

Canastota is the only public school in Central New York, and one of only 10 in the state, to be included in this year's National Yearbook Program of Excellence. The National Yearbook Program of Excellence recognizes engaging yearbooks that reflect a broad representation of the student body while helping students develop 21st century skills such as communication, collaboration, and information and communication technologies literacy.

Kyle Hale Earns FFA Empire Degree



Junior Kyle Hale has earned his FFA Empire Degree, a statewide award recognizing his extensive leadership, service and commitment to FFA and the agriculture field. He will receive his award in May, during the NYS FFA Convention.

He is just the second Canastota student to earn this award since the school's FFA chapter was re-chartered in 2007, FFA advisor Paula Burnor said.

To earn this award, Kyle had to complete a lengthy and rigorous process, including two years of active FFA participation, 360 hours of agriculture education and 25 hours of community service outside of his supervised agricultural experience. He also had to serve as an officer in his local chapter, deliver a six-minute speech on a topic relevant to FFA, plan chapter activities, participate in at least five activities beyond the chapter level, and maintain his grades in all of his classes, among many other requirements.

FBLA Receives State Recognition


Economics teacher Carrie Ann Ronalds, Family and Consumer Science teacher Gabby Freeland

JSHS Named To National Excellence List

Canastota Junior/Senior High School has earned a national ranking on this year's U.S. News and World Report Best High Schools list. It is the 4th consecutive year that Canastota has earned national recognition from U.S. News for its quality programs and student successes.

Factors used to rank schools included college readiness, college curriculum breadth, math and reading proficiency, math and reading performance, performance of underserved students and graduation rate.

The magazine cited the school's 88% math proficiency, 82% reading proficiency and 82% graduation rate among its achievement data. Canastota has an 18% participation rate for Advanced Placement exams and a 58% rate of AP passing scores. The list also noted the school's 16:1 student-teacher ratio and that 53% of students are economically disadvantaged.

"I applaud the hard work of our students and teachers. They are so committed to creating an exceptional and caring learning environment," Junior/Senior High School Principal Jay Altobello said. "Thank you to the Canastota community for its incredible continued support."
